2017 Model A Day VII

Each year the Model A Ford Foundation, Inc. (MAFFI) sponsors Model A Day and each year the event has expanded and the attendance grown as Model A enthusiasts gather to celebrate their beloved Model A Ford. This year's event was held September 15 - 17 at the site of the MAFFI Model A Ford Museum at the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan.

While the official Model A Day celebration was on Saturday, September 16th, the festivities were spread throughout the weekend. Preceding the weekend activities at the Gilmore was Thursday's annual MAFFI Trustees meeting and planning session. This was followed by an all-day work session on Friday at the Museum for MAFFI Trustees and other volunteers. For those Model A Day attendees arriving on Friday, driving tours and activities around Kalamazoo were available.

Friday evening's activities were highlighted by an interesting seminar presented by Stan Johnson, past MAFFI President, on "How the Model A Helped Win World War II." At this seminar, Stan presented a brief history of the Russian Ford plant in Gorky and the important role played by the Model AA truck during the war. This presentation was a part of the first year Museum exhibit on "A's Around the World."

On Saturday, more than 125 Model A Fords and many modern cars passed through the gates at the Gilmore for Model A Day. The weather was great and attendees found many different activities, seminars and displays to attract their attention. At the swap meet, hosted by the Illinois Region of MARC/Chapter of MAFCA, vendors were offering a wide variety of Model A parts, supplies and memorabilia – and even a complete Model A -- for sale.

With all the Gilmore Car Museum buildings open, attendees found an extensive collection of over 400 different antique vehicles on display for their enjoyment.

Inside the Model A Ford Museum, visitors viewed over 20 different Model A vehicles, Model A-related displays, new era fashion exhibits and displays related to the first year of the Foundation's "A's Around the World" theme. These included a striking right-hand drive British Model A De Luxe Phaeton (on loan from Tom Mack) and a Russian Model A engine (donated by Phil Ierardi and restored by Louis Ironside).

Jerry served in many capacities including facility management while Stan helped not only with establishing archives in The Gilmore library, but also worked to help raise funds and much needed contributions. It should also be mentioned that we are completely debt free.

We have new positions and are pleased to announce. Tom Mack, Larry Wallace and Ross Milne were sworn in as trustees during the board meeting and Olle Bergstrom was appointed International Liaison. While more will be written about the newly created International Liaison position, let me simply state that the objectives include having greater knowledge and exposure of Model A production and marketing outside of North America. Again, we want to make the Museum a great experience for our visitors, which includes adding new exhibits to our floor space. In speaking of floor space, this is an area where we pay special attention. Currently, in our Museum, we have a special display which includes the Russian built

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GAZ engine, an interactive exhibit that demonstrates the method of starting a Model A engine, a right hand drive Deluxe Phaeton built in England, a Model A school bus exhibit, an oil tanker and wrecker, a postal vehicle, an airplane, Thomas Edison's personal car, and Model A vehicles for virtually every year and body style as well as exhibits of era fashions and memorabilia. That's a lot to showcase and feedback from visitors continues to tell us we have one of the best collections and displays at The Gilmore.

If you haven't been to our Museum at The Gilmore, please consider a visit. You won't be disappointed. If you been before, come again. We are constantly changing displays and providing new information we think you will enjoy. And in closing, your ideas and suggestions to improve our Museum and experience for our visitors is always welcome.

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During the day on Saturday, five additional Model A related seminar sessions were offered. A seminar on *Front End Assembly* was presented by Bob Murphy and Jerry Sund. Judith Coebly spoke on Model A Era Fashions in her talk on *Vintage in Style: From Pouch to Purse*. Jim Cannon presented *Installing a Cell Phone Power Outlet in a Model A*. Ron Ehrenhofer discussed *Roadside Trouble Shooting* and Vince Scalabrino presented a seminar on *Model A Accessories*.

In addition to the Model A's and Model AA's on display inside the Museum, others were parked outside the Museum. These included two rare vehicles brought by Tim Kelly: a 1930 Model A Town Car and a 1931 Model A Town Car Delivery. Dan Whipple not only had his Model AA Popcorn Truck on display but was selling popcorn from it to benefit the MAFFI Museum. Also present was a unique 1930 Model A prototype vehicle – a rare Four-Wheel Drive Model A commercial vehicle owned by Ron Smith. Glenn Heim brought his 1950 Russian GAZ-67B military vehicle with Model A components to compliment the "A's Around the World" exhibit.

One could not miss the large 1931 Model AA Standrive Truck, on loan from Dee Dee Kaufmann. This truck, often referred to as a "Model AA Milk Truck," was designed for neighborhood door-to-door deliveries and was operated by the driver from a standing position. (This rare vehicle will remain on display at the Museum for at least one year for visitors not able to attend this year's Model A Day to enjoy.)

Opening the mid-day Saturday MAFFI membership meeting and ceremonies, Louis Ironside, 2017 Model A Day Committee Chairman, welcomed all attendees and introduced outgoing MAFFI President Loukie Smith. Loukie thanked everyone for their ongoing support of the Foundation and the Model A Ford Museum and provided a review of recent Museum changes and addition and upcoming activities. Loukie also introduced three new MAFFI Trustees: Tom Mack, Ross Milne and Larry Wallace.

After thanking outgoing Trustees Jerry Morrissey and Stan Braden for their dedication to MAFFI and their hard work, Loukie introduced the new MAFFI President, John Begg, and the new MAFFI Vice-President, Lou Ironside. These two individuals – plus Secretary, Janice Barker, Treasurer, Gene Tallone, and Executive Director, John Marshall -- will make up the group of officers to lead MAFFI.

Incoming MAFFI President John Begg indicated he was honored to be the new MAFFI President and thanked all Foundation contributors and supporters – including several new donations announced at the meeting. He also thanked Loukie Smith for her dedication and service to MAFFI. John then recognized and thanked two other MAFFI past Presidents in attendance – Ross Milne and Stan Johnson -- and past Executive Director Art Callan. Donna Lewis, a former MAFFI Trustee, was also recognized.

At these MAFFI ceremonies Stan Johnson provided a brief history of and the method of nominating, electing and installing new members into the Model A Ford Hall of Fame. The new 2017 inductees to the Model A Hall of Fame were then announced, their photo posters displayed and their background information presented by Jim Thomas. The four new 2017 inductees are: Peter Edmund Martin, Ford Vice-President, Joseph A Galamb, Ford Chief Engineer, Edie Davis Jones, MAFFI First President, and Kenneth B. Brewer, MARC Second President. Loukie officially proclaimed the induction of these four new Hall of Fame members. Plaques honoring each have been added to the Hall of Fame display wall inside the Museum.

Concluding the ceremonies was the awarding of the 2017 MAFFI *Outstanding Service Award* to Jerry and Trudy Morrissey. Jerry, an outgoing MAFFI Trustee, was recognized and thanked for his six many years of service as a Trustee and in his role as the first Model A Ford Museum Manager.

A new feature at this year's Model A Day festivities was the release of a limited edition Model A Day 2017 commemorative pin featuring the 1931 Model AA Standrive Truck, this year's featured Model A Day vehicle. These Standrive pins, designed and produced through the efforts of MAF8FI Trustee Suzan O'Neal, were sold at Model A Day and are available at the Gilmore gift shop while supplies last. Plans are being developed to produce and release a new commemorative pin each year at Model A Day.




