# **Museum Member Highlight: Meet Jessee Eaton**

From an early age, he's been fascinated with mechanics and vehicles. But, as many of you know, the Model A Ford isn't a common thing that a 19 year old guy is just deeply involved with... so why the interest?

The first experience, and a lasting one, he had with a Ford Model A was with a neighbor, an elderly widow who still had a 1930 Model A Coupe stored quietly away in the garage behind her house, which her husband had been working to restore shortly before he passed away. As a child, he remembers the days when his dad



would scoop him up and take him over to her garage, where he would spend long hours cleaning and waxing the car, trying to take care of it for the elderly woman. His favorite memory of this Coupe was climbing up in the rumble seat and imagining being driven in a parade, throwing candy to the crowd.

Years later, he met two very special people, by the names of Norman and Judith Smith. They owned two model A's, a 29 Tudor and a 29 Roadster, along with two Thunderbirds, a Shelby Cobra, and a 15 Metz Touring Car. Years after he met the Smith's, they contacted him to tell me they were selling their Tudor, and he just had to have it, dreaming of owning a Model A Ford since the day he first laid eyes on that old coupe in his neighbor's garage.

Today, he is a Sophomore in college enrolled at Freed Hardeman University in Henderson, TN. He is originally from West Virginia, which meant he had to leave his beloved Tudor at home while at school. He is very interested in Fine Point Restorations and is currently in the process of procuring parts to begin the process of restoring his Tudor to fine point judging standards.

While he has not been able to visit the Model A Museum, he is extremely grateful to Don Turley and Richard Lawson who sponsored my lifetime membership. After graduation, he hopes to be able to become active with the museum and to restore many more Model A's.


